On March 18th the City Council held a Goal Setting meeting. We went over a variety of items which included a Strategic Plan Discussion, Financial Overview / Budget approval schedule, Police / Code Enforcement, Engineering, Recreation, Human Resources / Risk Management, Public Works, Technology Services (IT), Community Development, Economic Development, City Clerk, Finance, Fire, Measure H, Employee Recognition, and AB 361 – Teleconferencing.

We also had a preview of the City's new website. In addition, I made for a call in support of some new ideas to be considered. A Cannabis Revenue Study, Homeless designated outreach worker, Reopening of River Bluff Regional Park, Annual celebration of Ceres birthday, Park Ranger Program or contract with Modesto in order to maintain our parks, a 4th of July Celebration Fireworks or a drone display, More funding for National Night Out, Love Ceres support and funding, Designating Landmarks in the City, and Cinco de Mayo parade participation.
